#### A focus on Protected Characteristics

Also, in school this week we are focusing on Protected Characteristics and an important part of the work we do as educators is to ensure students move through school and into the wider world aware that certain characteristics are protected by law (the Equality Act of 2010) and that discrimination in all its forms is not to be accepted.

Students this week have been working with their tutors and in PSHE following a whole school assembly highlighting the fact that it is against the law to discriminate against anyone because of these protected characteristics: age, gender reassignment, being married or in a civil partnership, being pregnant or on maternity leave, disability, race including colour, nationality, ethnic or national origin, religion or belief, sex or sexual orientation. And that legal protection covers a variety of situations, such as: at work, in education, as a consumer, when using public services, when buying or renting property and as a member or guest of a private club or association.

Looking at this legal protection has acted as a springboard for discussion and education with the students able to talk about this topic with the kindness and respect for others in the room and with honesty about how they feel about it. Linked to the focus on these protected characteristics is a look at the month-long annual celebration of lesbian, gay, bisexual and trans, and non-binary (LGBT+) history. It is also an opportunity to reflect on the history of LGBT+ rights and related civil rights movements. LGBT+ History Month takes place from the 1st to the 28th of February 2024 and this year highlights the contribution made by the LGBT+ community to medicine.

Working towards continuing to make Eskdale and wider society inclusive and welcoming for all is a most noble aim.

#### Year 11 academic support in full swing now...

Year 11 are well into their final full term of lessons before the summer's exam season starts in May. Academic support sessions are in place with staff giving time to help students outside their normal lesson times. Students should be engaging with the programme when prompted by staff and every minute really counts now. There is still time in these remaining few months to boost the final grades!
