
day. This year it is Wednesday 26 June.

panto to CCW?













Year 7 Science News



























Why study Physics at WSF

What will I study?

No computers, no internet, no smartphones. The digital age as we know it would not exist. Modern physicists have been responsible for some of the greatest achievements of our era.

By studying A-level physics, you're setting out to understand and explain the entire universe! It's a pretty ambitious task, but one that physicists everywhere are constantly striving to achieve, from the smallest particles in existence to the great expanse of space.

Boys and girls - if you love science and are excited to enter the world of science, technology, engineering and mathematics, don't let anything put you off.

How will I be assessed?

100% exam at the end of the course.

What can I do to prepare?

Talk to other students who are already doing physics and ask them what they have done or wish they had done.

Teachers in the Science Department are there to help you and give you information and advice.



What do students do afterwards?

Why do our students study A-level physics? It could be for the income, the future prospects or the sheer intellectual stimulation.

Whatever your reasons, you can progress to university to study a degree in a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) subject. Physicists are highly regarded for their problem-solving skills in real life contexts. So, this qualification is extremely useful, even if you're planning to follow a different career path.

Students who have studied physics at this College have gone on to study and work in careers such as engineering, instrumentation, medicine, architecture, computer science, games design, architecture, healthcare, forensics, music technology and many more!

The Observatory

The announcement early last year of the gift of an Observatory by Mrs Bruce was received with much enthusiasm by the scientifically-inclined members of the School, both Staff and Pupils.


For nearly a year their keenness has been increased by occasional glimpses of heavenly bodies, but now their anticipations have been realized, and the Observatory has come to stay. The difficulties attendant on the acceptance of the splendid gift have been mentioned in previous issues of "The Viking"; the practical side appealed to the Science VI, who one fine day in March carried the whole of the fittings, in many and various pieces, round to the School. The transport of the base of the telescope's mounting, which weighs half-a-ton, presented rather a problem. It was solved by rolling the mass bodily along on the ground to its temporary resting place inside the front door. The Observatory was then dismantled and rebuilt, with six feet of additional space, on the selected site in a corner of the girls' level. There it now stands, splendid in new paint and varnish, a tribute to, the untiring energies of Mr Ripley.

Thus, the School has added the Observatory to its already fairly comprehensive possessions. The use of the building will add a new interest to the study of physics, as the present keenness proves. In future, boys passing through the School will be able to receive valuable practical instruction and experience in this most interesting subject.
